Word of the Day

This week's vocabulary has been: subtle, adhere, describe, tycoon and flammable. How can you weave these in to this weekend's conversation?

In Monday's assembly, the national day of commemoration for Stephen Lawrence was observed, focusing on the tireless work of Baroness Lawrence to create 'an inclusive society for everyone to live their best life, regardless of gender, race, sexuality, religion, disability or background'. The children also looked at No Woman, No Cry - a painting by artist Chris Ofili depicting a crying woman (Doreen Lawrence) and featuring a series of pale blue tears descending from each of her eyes, all of which feature a very small collaged photograph of a boy's face.

On Thursday, Miss Gammon focused on Earth Day 2024: Planet vs Plastics in her assembly. During discussions, the children focused on plastic use, why plastic is potentially harmful and the responsibility of all to be environmentally friendly, and raise awareness.

Year 1 children visited Creekside Discovery Centre as part of their science learning on animals and plants. A variety of learning activities took place across the day, including pond dipping and a minibeast hunt. The children were able to closely observe a variety of animals and plants in their natural habitat, including tadpoles, shrimp, crabs, and even a toad! They learnt more about why habitats are important and how we can help to preserve them. A fantastic time was had by all!
