Assemblies

Monday's assembly, led by Miss Peterson, followed on from a previous one regarding resolutions and focused on 'stickability': the importance of building good habits and breaking unfavourable ones. Children were asked about habits they might like to continue focusing on and were introduced to the idea of 'building your streak'. To create a long lasting habit, we need to build an unbroken record of the intended habit in order for it to become automatic and part of our subconscious. Children suggested things such as reading before bed, getting more exercise, practising spellings or bike riding. 'Stickability' is something that requires commitment, perseverance and self-regulation but when achieved, can help build strength of character, trust and resilience in order to be better equipped when things become difficult.

On Thursday, Miss Ford's assembly theme was 'curiosity'. The children reflected on the meaning of the word and what they're curious about, and how they demonstrate this. In conclusion, they were reminded that being curious: helps us grow and learn; challenges us and prompts questions; provides us with information to share and helps us navigate the world in which we live.

On Friday, the recognition assembly was a fitting end to the week as ever, acknowledging individual outstanding learning and achievement across the curriculum, and celebrating teamwork. Elspeth Geden was part of the celebration this week and enjoyed seeing how we share success together.

On Thursday, our boys' football team had their first set of matches. The team beat Ealdham 3-2 in their first match and then drew 0-0 with Christchurch Shooters Hill in the second. The team showed great teamwork and zest, and were unlucky not to win both games.

Absence Reporting

If your child is unwell and unable to attend school, please report this using the absence line: 020 8858 5497 - option 1. Absences must be reported daily.

From Monday 13th March: if you are reporting your child absent via email, please use our new attendance email attendance@sherington.greenwich.sch.uk.

Any evidence relating to absences i.e. doctors appointments, prescriptions etc should also be sent to this address. You can continue to report absences by phone using the absence line. All other general enquiries should continue to be sent to sao@sherington.greenwich.sch.uk Parents and carers are reminded of the importance of high attendance. High attendance leads to great achievement. We receive a number of requests for pupils to be absent from school during term time.

Parents are reminded that the school cannot authorise a leave of absence for a holiday and we will only grant a leave of absence for exceptional circumstances. Every day of school missed by a pupil reduces their attendance by 0.5%, meaning that a child with 95% attendance has missed ten whole days of school and a child with 90% attendance has missed twenty whole days of school. By the time a pupil is persistently absent (85% attendance), they have missed six weeks, or half a term, of schooling.
