As I mentioned previously, we are considering a number of possibilities regarding wraparound care and looking forward to meeting with another member of Greenwich's LEA next week - after which we should have greater clarity regarding feasible options.

We are continuing to engage with staff at Montbelle, investigating further opportunities for professional development - learning from each other. Miss Bull visited Reception classrooms there on Wednesday to look at environment, provision and planning. Miss Edwards has spent time at Sherington with Montbelle's French lead in order to conduct moderation of resources and outcomes, and will spend an afternoon there next week to do the same.

I am pleased to announce that training for our Forest School lead begins very soon and we are busy preparing 'base camp'. Forest School is a child-centred inspirational learning process that offers opportunities for holistic growth through regular sessions. It is a long-term programme supporting play, exploration and calculated risk taking. It develops confidence and self-esteem through learner inspired, hands-on experiences in a natural setting.

Yesterday, it was wonderful to spend the day with Hannah Freeman, who starts with us in September as the new headteacher. She was welcomed by staff members and we spent time looking at a variety of school policies, procedures and practices, and started preparation for the autumn term. I am delighted to be working with Hannah and hope she will be able to join us again over the coming weeks.
