On Tuesday, year 5 students visited the Museum of London Docklands to view the London, Sugar and Slavery exhibit. ## **Medicine Policy**

As a school we are unable to administer any medication that is not prescribed. Any prescribed medicines must be handed to Mrs Ryan or Mrs Healy at the school office. A consent form will need to be completed by a parent or carer with parental responsibility.

## **Double Parking Outside School**

We aim to have no double parking, and call on adults to exercise self-regulation in this matter. The safety of the school (and wider) community is our primary concern. We ask that parents walk or get public transport whenever possible. Failing that, find a safe place to park and walk to the school from there to ensure everyone's safety.

## **Parents' Evening**

Many parents have already booked their appointments for our Pupil Led Parents' Evening on 31<sup>st</sup> March and 1<sup>st</sup> April for our Reception to Year 6 children. This is a valuable opportunity for children to present their learning to their parents/carers. These meetings are scheduled for ten minutes.

There will be some consultation time with the teacher during this. However, should you feel that you would like longer, please arrange a separate meeting with the class teacher after (or prior to) this pupil led session. You can do so by completing a meeting request form at the office.

(Nursery have their own arrangements for parents' consultations).

You will also be able to book a separate 10 minute session with Miss Portman should you wish to discuss music.

We place great emphasis on pupils talking about their own learning and progress.
