Governors wish to thank Elspeth Geden for her work in supporting Sherington's Senior Leadership Team and the work of the school. We're confident that her experience and approach as executive head are invaluable during this interim period. In seeking to appoint a permanent headteacher for September the recruitment panel has now advertised the post. We will be shortlisting and interviewing during the second half of this term, with the close involvement of representatives from the local authority. It is our aim that the person appointed will continue to be sympathetic to Sherington's ethos, philosophy and practice. Head lice

If your child has head lice, please let the office know so we can send a text to the year group asking parents to check and treat their children's hair. Please see <u>Head lice and nits - NHS (www.nhs.uk)</u> for more information on how to treat head lice at home.

PE

Please note that PE is part of the National Curriculum and the expectation is that every child takes part in PE lessons. If your child is well enough to be in school, they are well enough to do PE and exemptions are only made following risk assessments following injuries or surgery.

Uniform

Please ensure all uniform is labelled; this helps us return lost items. Lost property can be found on the Creation Station decking in a large metal container.

Appointments

If you are taking your child out of school to attend an appointment for either them, or yourself, you must provide evidence to the school office. Please try to make appointment outside of school hours whenever possible.

Double Parking

Please DO NOT double park on any of the roads around the perimeter of the school premises. This is dangerous, first and foremost, and blocks in our neighbours and other parents. We will be liaising with the Greenwich Traffic Enforcement Team.

Mobile phones

Parents and carers must not use mobile phones in the playground and school building. This is for the safety of the children and staff.

Communication

The school's usual way of communicating reminders and short messages is via text message. If you have downloaded the SchoolMoney/Eduspot app, please ensure your notifications are turned on as messages will come via the app. If you do not have the app and are not receiving messages, please let the office know as we may have the wrong number for you.

Road Safety

It has been reported that children are playing on the roads locally outside of school hours, pushing a skate board in front of oncoming traffic for example. Please remind your child/children about the importance of road safety for themselves and others.

Absence Reporting

If your child is unwell and unable to attend school, please report this using the absence line: 020 8858 5497 - option 1. Absences must be reported daily.

From Monday 13th March: if you are reporting your child absent via email, please use our new attendance email attendance@sherington.greenwich.sch.uk.

Any evidence relating to absences i.e. doctors appointments, prescriptions etc. should also be sent to this address. You can continue to report absences by phone using the absence line. All other general enquiries should continue to be sent to sao@sherington.greenwich.sch.uk. Parents and carers are reminded of the importance of high attendance. High attendance leads to great achievement. We receive a number of requests for pupils to be absent from school during term time.

Parents are reminded that the school cannot authorise a leave of absence for a holiday and we will only grant a leave of absence for exceptional circumstances. Every day of school missed by a pupil reduces their attendance by 0.5%, meaning that a child with 95% attendance has missed ten whole days of school and a child with 90% attendance has missed twenty whole days of school. By the time a pupil is persistently absent (85% attendance), they have missed six weeks, or half a term, of schooling.
