What We Are Learning


The first text we will read is 'Super Duper You' by Sophy Henn. This book celebrates all the different, extraordinary and sometimes contradictory things we are - looking at what makes us unique.

Throughout this half-term, we will also be looking at 'You Choose' by Nick Sharratt.

Next half-term, we will be using the following texts:

- 'Leaf Man' by Lois Elhert
- 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' by Mara Alperin





The learning environment enables independent learning and discovery, with continuous provision set up so that the children can self-select and organise their resources for learning. They will be encouraged to interact with these learning challenges:

- Rhythm and rhyme in words, songs, poems and stories
- Hearing initial sounds
- Name recognition and writing
- Mark making in various forms
- Counting
- Autumn, winter and changes in the environment

How to help at home

Reading daily and encouraging a growing interest in books is vital. Please make time for storytelling, singing and nursery rhymes.

Include **maths** in everyday activities such as laying the table, shopping, sharing items and playing games.

Use rich, interesting **vocabulary** with your child and speak in full sentences. This could be when describing something they see, or having a conversation with them about their feelings.

<u>Clothing</u>

Please ensure that your child has a raincoat for wet days and a warm coat for colder days. These should be clearly named. Please also ensure that your child has appropriate and practical footwear on for nursery (i.e. not open toes, strappy sandals or heels).

<u>Water</u>

Your child should be provided with a water bottle, which is clearly identifiable as belonging to them.

Spare clothes

Please ensure that your child has at least one spare set of clothing (including underwear and socks) in a clearly named bag.
