### **Phonics**

The children will be continuing to follow the progression of the Little Wandle programme in phonics. They will be learning phase 3 phonemes and tricky words as well as developing the skills to segment and blend longer words.

# Literacy

The children will begin by exploring the text 'The Emperor's Egg' by Martin Jenkins. Furthermore, they will be exploring non-fiction texts linked to animals and the world around them, moving on to growth and change in the second half of the spring term.

Whilst investigating information texts, the children will learn about presenting information gathered using different media.

Additionally, the children will be learning about the celebrations of Lunar New Year and Pancake Day.

Throughout this half term, we will be using the following key texts:

- 'The Emperor's Egg' by Martin Jenkins
- 'The Three Little Pigs' by DK Publications

Next half term, we will be using the following key texts:

- 'The Extraordinary Gardener' by Sam Boughton
- 'Jack and the Beanstalk' by Miles Kelly

Literacy priorities for this term:

- 1. I can write all the letters of the alphabet, most of which are correctly formed.
- 2. I can spell words by identifying the sounds and then writing the corresponding letter/s.

Please enjoy as many stories as you can with your child at home.

### Maths

This term, the children will be exploring measurement in a variety of different contexts. Parallel to learning the concepts of length, weight and capacity, they will expand key vocabulary in order to extend mathematical language and understanding.

The children will also deepen their understanding of number composition through learning about number bonds.

Maths curriculum priorities for this term:

- 1. I can use appropriate vocabulary when exploring measurement
- 2. I can recall some number bonds to 5
