Develop short dance with workshops filmed for future use for all classes. Provision of notes of how to improve practice and adapt for future use.	All classes taught a dance for our Arts Week performances based on the theme 'Our Canvas'. Sherington staff worked alongside a Laban dance professional to create contemporary dances to showcase to parents during our annual Arts Week. The dances, based on selected art pieces, provide valuable cultural capital through the medium of dance for pupils who may not have exposure to the arts in such an active way.

To increase opportunities for after school clubs by hiring two sports coaches one indoor and one outdoor club every night on offer. PE coaches provide training for teachers to develop their teaching of outdoor PE skills.	Sports coach provided sports provision before school, during play/lunch and after school for children. Disadvantaged children given the opportunity to engage in the after school clubs. Funding provided to subsidise pupils from low income families to engage with after school activities.
